This has been a remarkably fast year! The students have been working on several different projects, but my favorite was the La Llorona dance with the 7th and 8th graders, in which they just performed beautifully at Town Meeting in November and they will perform again for the Fiesta. The students had to learn the meaning to all the lyrics of the song and be able to sing it well, before we learned traditional Mexican dance moves of Ballet Folklorico. I am extremely proud of their talents.

Also, second quarter we had a mock ice cream shop in Spain. Role play is critical to language development and it's one of the greater linguistical challenges second language educators face, because it is challenging for old students to use their imagination. However, the kids loved it! They ordered ice cream in Spanish as if they were at a study abroad program in Spain and they even created their own ice cream shop menu in Spanish. We focused on the names of flavors, compared the monetary differences between Mexico and Spain, and we learned the geography of Europe. All the classes will get to participate in this activity, and so will you at Fiesta.

In January, we will continue to work on the grammatical structures of the language. In addition to learning the advanced conventions of language, the 6th and 7th grades will begin to work on their dance to Vivir Mi Vida by Marc Anthony. Their song is from Puerto Rico and we will be learning about this country's geography and their cultural differences, as well.
